

# Visitor Policy During COVID-19

## Visitor Requirements

- ▶ All visitors are required to wear a face mask (cloth or surgical)
- ▶ Visitors will be screened at specific entry points and only be allowed if they do not have symptoms of COVID-19: fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, or diarrhea.
- ▶ Visitors must stay in the patient's room.
- ▶ Visitors should perform hand hygiene using hand gel or soap and water while limiting surfaces touched.
- ▶ Visitors should maintain at least 6 feet of distance from patients when eating or drinking.

### For Inpatient and Emergency Department:

#### **ONE VISITOR will be permitted except:**

- ▶ Two parents or caregivers may accompany pediatric patients.
- ▶ Additional visitors will be granted for end-of-life care or end-of-life decision making.

### For all Outpatient Hospital and Clinic appointments:

#### **ONE VISITOR will be permitted to accompany a patient to facilitate care or treatment except:**

- ▶ Two parents or caregivers may accompany pediatric patients.

### For all Surgical and Procedural appointments:

#### **ONE VISITOR will be permitted to accompany the patient in the pre-op and post-op areas.**

### For Patients in isolation for COVID-19:

#### **ONE VISITOR will be permitted at a time with up to two visitors in a 24-hour period.**

- ▶ Visitors should go directly to the patient's room and avoid common areas.
- ▶ Visitors will wear the appropriate personal protective equipment as directed by staff.
- ▶ Following their visit, visitors should follow the CDC's quarantine guidelines.
